

## Directions:

**From Bend:** Follow Highway 31 toward the town of Silver Lake. One mile west of Silver Lake is a turnoff to the south marked "Thompson Reservoir and Silver Creek Marsh Campground." This road is Lake County Road 4-11 and USFS Road 27. Turn south (the only direction you can turn!) and follow USFS 27 for 22.75 miles. Near Milepost 18 there is a Y in the road; USFS Road 3142 is the left (east) fork and USFS Road 27 is the right (west) fork. Stay on USFS 27. Begin watching for milepost markers on the west (right) side of the road. After Milepost 21, you'll cross a cattleguard. Drive past the cattleguard, passing Milepost 22, and turn right (west) on a gravel road that goes up the hill. There is a signboard posted at the road entrance that says "Road Closed" and "Posted No Trespassing; Access by Permission Only; The Nature Conservancy" and "43235" (Forest road 27). Stay on this road and park in the marked area on the hill above the Research Station. If you miss the driveway entrance off USFS 27, you will quickly (within 0.3 miles) drive out of the forest and into a broad, open meadow. If you pass milepost 23 & reach the meadow, turn around and head north, taking the first left (west) turn off the 27 Road.

**From Klamath Falls:** Follow Highway 140 to a point 3 miles west of the town of Bly, milepost 50.3. At that point, turn north onto USFS Road 30, also called Ivory Pine Road. Follow the Ivory Pine Road about 12.4 miles, until you cross a cattleguard and then see a major road junction with USFS Road 27. Turn left (west) and follow USFS 27, where you will cross another cattle guard at 23.5 miles soon followed by the end of the pavement. There is an intersection with USFS 46 road, to Chiloquin, at 26.2 miles, but continue straight (North). About 34.1 miles from the original intersection with highway 140 is Long Creek, just 0.3 miles north of milepost 25. From there, begin looking for milepost markers on the west (left) side of USFS Road 27. Just about 2.5 miles north of Long Creek, the road leaves the forest and enters a broad, open meadow. From that point, continue about 0.8 miles north on USFS Road 27, passing through the meadow. You'll reenter a forested area and pass Milepost 23 then take the first left (west) turn off the 27 Road, onto a gravel road that goes up the hill. There is a signboard posted at the road entrance that says "Road Closed" and "Posted No Trespassing; Access by Permission Only; The Nature Conservancy". Stay on this road and park in the marked area on the hill above the Research Station.

**From Paisley:** From Highway 31, about 16 miles south of the town of Summer Lake and 11 miles north of the town of Paisley, there is a turn to the west (uphill) marked "Government Harvey Pass". This is USFS Road 29. Turn up the hill and follow the main road (do not take turns for roads marked 3360, 012 or 017). Follow this road to the top of the grade, about 10 miles. At the T at the top of the grade, follow USFS Road 29 to the left (south). Go 2 miles, down a steep pitch to the junction with USFS Road 28. Go right (north) on USFS Road 28 for about 17 miles. At that point, USFS Road 28 turns sharply right (north), and USFS Road 3142 continues in the same direction you've just been traveling. Follow USFS Road 3142 for about 3 miles, where it Y's into USFS Road 27. Turn left (south) on USFS Road 27. Begin watching for milepost markers on the west (right) side of the road. After Milepost 21, you'll cross a cattleguard. Drive about 0.7 miles past the cattleguard, passing Milepost 22, and turn right (west) on a gravel road that goes up the hill. There is a signboard posted at the road entrance that says "Road Closed" and "Posted No Trespassing; Access by Permission Only; The Nature Conservancy". Stay on this road and park in the marked area on the hill above the Research Station. If you miss the driveway entrance off USFS 27, you will quickly (within 0.3 miles) drive out of the forest and into a broad open meadow. If you reach milepost 23 & the meadow, turn around and head north, taking the first left (west) turn off the 27 Road.

**From Chiloquin:** From the town of Chiloquin, go east about 5 miles on the Sprague River Highway, to the Williamson River Road. Turn left (north) on the Williamson River Road and go about 25 miles. Here the paved road turns into gravel and is now called USFS Road 46. Continue east another 12 miles on USFS 46, to where it turns into USFS Road 27. At the T, go left (north) and follow USFS 27 about 10 miles. You'll cross a marked bridge at Long Creek after about 6 miles. From there, begin looking for milepost markers on the west side of USFS Road 27. Just about 2.5 miles north of Long Creek, the road leaves the forest and enters a broad, open meadow. From that point, continue about 0.8 miles north on USFS Road 27, passing through the meadow. You'll reenter a forested area and pass Milepost 23, then take the first left (west) turn off the 27 Road, onto a gravel road that goes up the hill. There is a signboard posted at the road entrance that says "Road Closed" and "Posted No Trespassing; Access by Permission Only; The Nature Conservancy". Stay on this road and park in the marked area on the hill above the Research Station.
