


with the Fisheries and Wildlife Club showing off the FW department's amazing specimens collections. There is so much going on, and even more to look forward to (as always)! Go Beavs!

The Native Fish Committee of the Oregon Chapter American Fisheries Society organizes annual field workshops featuring nongame native fish in Oregon. This year, the committee will study the endemic fish of Goose Lake, including the Goose Lake Tui Chub, sucker, and lamprey. We will hear presentations and engage in discussions regarding the species and sample for them in the field.

There is no charge to participate in the workshop or to camp the night of the workshop. Everyone is welcome to participate and students are encouraged to attend.

The workshop will start noon September 12th at the Fremont-Winema NF Headquarters large conference room (1301 South G Street, Lakeview, Or) with presentations and we'll camp that night at Drews Creek Campground, 35 minutes SW of Lakeview. Bring your own water and camping gear. Dinner and evening refreshments will be provided September 12th (Courtesy of OCAFS). Bring your own food for other meals.

The morning of September 13th, we will sample for the featured species to gain a better understanding of their habitat and take photos. The workshop will end at noon on September 13th.




